Exceeded established goals for personnel and resource conservation across all labor categories and throughout our funding profile.

Director and Senior Advisor Army Budget Office May 2009 - June 2010 (1 year 2 months) Pentagon, Washington, DC

Developed and implemented resource management strategy, to include the \$225 billion President's Budget for the Department of the Army (FY 2011). Implemented funding and resourcing alternatives to allow the Army to close a \$6B mid-year funding gap and fully prosecute the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan. Oversaw the work of four subordinate SES or General Officers, as well as the staffing and operations of the Army Budget Office. In this position I was responsible for reviewing and approving the Army's justification books for all our appropriations as well as all the Army's budget roll-out materials, a very detailed set of documents.

Director, Operations and Support March 2006 - May 2009 (3 years 3 months) Formulated, defended and executed the Army's key operational accounts, Operations and Maintenance, Army and the Military Pay appropriations, in total \$130 billion. Revitalized the budget development for the military pay accounts by changing the leadership, building the skill sets and implementing technology tools. When I came into this position, budget documents were often internally inconsistent and lacked both detail and relevance. I created budget documentation reviews, cross checks, and murder boards which significantly improved the materials that justified the President's Budget.

#### Director, Business Resources May 2005 - March 2006 (11 months)

Developed and controlled the \$20B Army Working Capital Fund, the \$56M Foreign Military Sales fund and the \$8B Information Technology Budget. Validating these budget materials required both operational understanding and attention to detail. Because capital was transferred out of the AWCF to support the war effort, I devised and executed a strategy to keep the fund solvent in 2006. Dual-hatted for most of this period as lead executive in other Army Budget positions.

#### Internal Revenue Service Acting Dep CFO and Associate CFO July 2002 - May 2005 (2 years 11 months)

Led the Internal Revenue Service's \$10 billion annual administrative budget and met new Office of Management and Budget deadlines for an accelerated clean financial audit. In these positions, I led a team of several hundred personnel, scattered across three offices in Washington DC and an additional finance office in Beckley, WV and therefore became adept at split based operations. Additionally, as the designated business lead, I revitalized and implemented the Internal Revenue Service's initially troubled SAP-based core accounting system. This accounting system passed GAO audit in the first year of operation.
