 Democrats' HEROES Act 2.0 passed on 10/1/2020 to meet urgent facility needs like quality air ventilation to reopen safely
 which ultimately resulted in two allowable uses for school facilities in the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency
 Relief Fund as passed into law in the Coronavirus Response Additional Supplemental Appropriations Act signed into law on
 12/28/2020
- Authored revisions to Title II of the Higher Education Act in H.R. 4674, The College Affordability Act passed out of
 Committee 10/30/2019 after collecting research and gathering experts for policy brainstorm and feedback; led hearing on
 educator preparation to support the policy changes reflected which included agenda-shaping, witness selection and memodrafting, supported 3-day markup on the bill, and wrote part of Committee Report
- Achieved bipartisan House passage of H.R. 3659, Danny's Law on 9/16/2020 from negotiating Manager's Amendment bill
 text with House Republican Committee counterparts, working with lead House Democratic sponsor's office, requesting floor
 time under suspension of the votes, and managing floor speakers for debate time
- Led Committee passage of H.R. 4301, the School Shooting and Safety Preparedness Act on 9/18/2019 which included
 providing bill text recommendations prior to introduction, securing on-Committee co-leads for introduction, improving bill
 text while managing group, stakeholder, and Member feedback in one week to introduce Manager's Amendment at markup,
 and encouraging Member engagement and real-time responses during markup debate
- Assisted the passage into law of the reauthorization of the Museum and Library Services Act of 2018 signed on 12/31/2018
- Provide technical assistance and strategic support to Member offices such as through producing policy memos, hearing
 questions, and talking points; provide data, talking points to Speaker's office, especially during pandemic negotiations
- Collaborate and negotiate with Committee Republican counterparts in House and Senate on policy and bill language

- Protect federal school safety and discipline policy from proposals lacking evidence which would harm students by dissuading Members from introducing such bills, educating staffers on stronger policy, and advocacy with other committees
- Provided extensive advice to Rep. McEachin's office to introduce a stronger proposal to ban corporal punishment in schools and one the Committee would support marking up in the 117th Congress, titled the *Protecting our Students Act*
- Co-drafting Chairman's next bill on lost instructional time and missing students to position extra funding for categorical
 programs like Title I, Title III, and IDEA in the next COVID-relief stimulus; collecting data, brainstorming and collaborating
 with experts and researchers on evidenced-based methods to close gaps in unfinished learning, how to target resources to the
 highest need students, and leverage pre-existing resources
