Under the mentorship of late civil rights leader - Congressman John Lewis, the Institute's Board Chair Emeritus - this DC- based nonpartisan Institute has worked to cultivate mutual respect, moral reflection, increased understanding, and honest conversation among political leaders to advance productive discourse and constructive collaboration for a more effective democracy. Capitol programs include leadership forums and small group discussions between members of the US Senate and House - and other national political leaders. Since 1998, Board Chair Emeritus Rep. John Lewis led FPI Congressional Civil Rights pilgrimages with hundreds of House and Senate colleagues, several US Presidents and Cabinet members, and other international and corporate leaders over the years to retrace nonviolent

freedom movements throughout the nation - and around the world. After Lewis' death in July 2020, FPI established a new program to fulfill his final mandate that "we all have roles to play" in strengthening our democracy as his mantle was passed to the next generation: the John Robert Lewis Scholars & Fellows Program. It was designed for undergraduate (Scholars) and graduate students (Fellows) to examine Lewis's nonviolent philosophy from a historical perspective; define its principles and strategies; and identify their applicability to modern times and movements, current issues, and everyday life. This growing nationwide network of emerging leaders are inspired to create positive societal change from the revolutionary nonviolent perspective that was employed with success in the modern Civil Rights Movement. A competitive application process selects students seeking to be effective changemakers in civic through an applied learning program inspired by the moral leadership of John Lewis, educated, and empowered to use Martin Luther King, Jr's principles and strategies of nonviolent social impact.
