Legislative Assistant, Subcommittee on Environment (January 2021– present)

- Assists in devising Subcommittee’s legislative agenda for the 117th Congress
- Oversees all aspects of the legislative process including bill drafting, conducting stakeholder outreach, collecting agency feedback, bill revising, coordinating co-sponsorship, and bill introduction

- Conducted in-depth research on complex environmental issues and summarized findings in brief policy memos
- Proposed hearing topics, identified expert witnesses, prepared background materials and suggested Member questions for full and subcommittee hearings
- Collected, catalogued, and analyzed submissions from over 350 stakeholder groups with stimulus proposals for the CARES Act and made formal recommendations to House Leadership
- Developed and implemented strategic outreach to environmental justice groups for subcommittee

- Compiled background materials including bill summaries, legislative history, and voting recommendations for Members in preparation for full committee and subcommittee markups
- Scheduled meetings with agencies, Member office staff, and stakeholder groups
